D. Approval of Minutes

1. Motion to approve the minutes of meeting held December 7, 2023, made by Stacie Dayhoff. (S) Catherine Chase-Lopez.

E. Updates and Reports

1. Recreation Manager, Lexie provided an update on the renaming of the Woodland Hall to the Kidd-Lee Center at Woodland Park. Lexie reported that it passed the Board of Supervisors that morning and that Local Child Care Planning Council would be putting in the order for the sign to be made. Amber stated that she put in the order prior to the Recreation Commission meeting and that once the sign has been completed, the goal is to have an unveiling of the signs to celebrate Jacki Lee and Gussie Kidd. Once a date has been set for the unveiling, information will be sent out.

F. Action Items

1. Hannah Harrison, Planning Department Community Design, presented the proposal for Public Art in the Midpines County Park. The presentation was made up of two project proposals for the Working Lands, Working Artists projects. The first project proposal is for a set of two murals. The proposed location for the murals is the

Midpines Hall doors and in the bus stop. The murals will be focused on cultivation and forestry and will be set on metal panels then attached to the hall doors and the bus stop. The second proposal is for a sculpture that depicts a Native American woman made up of mostly manzanita and iron. The sculpture will be 8-9 feet tall once completed and placed in a location that was selected with the Parks and Recreation, Engineering and Facilities divisions. Lexie confirmed that any maintenance, repair, vandalism etc. will be handled by the Planning Department/Arts Council. Member Stacie Dayhoff made a motion to approve the proposed artwork. (S) Amber Chambers.

2. Recreation Manager Lexie emailed the Recreation Commission the youth sports grants letters that were received for review prior to the meeting. Parks and Recreation received 5 letters, Yosemite Composite Mountain Biking, Mariposa Soccer League, Sierra Mtn. Flag Football, Mariposa Girls Youth Softball and Bears Youth Football and Cheer. Lexie informed the commission that there is \$7,000.00 available for funding. The commission members reviewed the request letters taking into consideration the number of participants, cost of registration/equipment, program information and the funding request and how it would be used to support the youth programs. Flag Football and Bears Football and Cheer did not include a set requested amount, Mariposa Soccer requested \$1,000.00, Girls Youth Softball requested \$1,700.00, Mountain Biking requested \$1,000.00. The commission has decided to award Mariposa Soccer League \$1,000.00, Yosemite Composite Mountain Biking \$1,000.00, Mariposa Girls Youth Softball \$2,000.00, Mariposa Bears Youth Football and Cheer \$2,000, and Sierra Mtn. Flag Football \$1,000.00. Motion made by Catherine Chase-Lopez. (S) Stacie Dayhoff.
